PLANNING PERIODS

A. Generally

Teachers shall use planning periods only for purposes directly related to improving the instructional program.

B. <u>High Schools</u>

Full-time high school classroom teachers are provide one (1) planning period per day, or the equivalent, as defined by the Virginia Board of Education, unencumbered of any teaching or supervisory duties. If a secondary school classroom teacher teaches more than the standard load of students or class periods per week, as defined by the Virginia Board of Education, an appropriate contractual arrangement and compensation is provided.

C. <u>Middle Schools</u>

Full-time middle school classroom teachers are provided one (1) planning period per day, or the equivalent, as defined by the Virginia Board of Education, unencumbered of any teaching or supervisory duties. If a secondary school classroom teacher teaches more than the standard load of students or class periods per week, as defined by the Virginia Board of Education, an appropriate contractual arrangement and compensation is provided.

D. <u>Elementary Schools</u>

Full-time elementary school classroom teachers are provided at least an average of thirty (30) minutes per day during the students' school week as planning time.

E. <u>Coverage for Other Teachers</u>

To ensure a consistent quality education for Albemarle County Public Schools students, teachers may, from time to time, be asked to provide short-term substitute coverage for other teachers during planning periods, without the expectation of additional compensation. School administrators shall establish procedures for equity and to minimize the impact on staff.
