

# **CROZET ADDITION, RENOVATIONS, AND SITE IMPROVEMENTS**

#### Scope

- +35,000 gross square foot in total additions to the building including 17 classrooms, associated support spaces, and expanded kitchen, cafeteria and media center.
- Replacement of the existing HVAC system with the County's first geothermal system , improved internal circulation, ADA upgrades
- Renovation of existing building
- Site improvements

#### **Recent Updates**

- Expanded playground, a new bus loop, and the office/admin area renovation have already been completed
- New kitchen addition is anticipated to be completed next spring
- Classroom addition and expanded movement/exercise addition anticipated to be completed in summer 2022



### **Previous Redistricting**

#### Phase I (Fall 2007):

• Transfer students from Crozet Elementary to Meriwether Lewis Elementary who live on Browns Gap Turnpike and Garth Road, from White Hall to Albemarle Lake Road

#### Phase II (Fall 2009):

• Transfer students from Crozet Elementary to Brownsville Elementary who live north side Jarmans Gap Road. Grayrock, Waylands Grant, Bargamin Loop and all homes on Jarmans Gap Rd from the intersection of Lanetown Rd to the intersection of Orchard Rd.

#### COMMITTEE OBJECTIVE AND SCOPE

# STUDY Objective

The purpose of this study is to address current and projected overcrowding at Brownsville Elementary. The proposed scope of the study will involve Brownsville and Crozet Elementary Schools only.

# GUIDING Principles

Attendance areas will serve the district for at least 3-5 years with a goal of 5-7 years

Attendance areas will be largely contiguous

Walk areas for each school will be considered

Transportation routes will be as efficient as possible, giving consideration to minimizing ride times within acceptable parameters

Neighborhoods will be assigned to the same school whenever possible

Greater demographic balance amongst impacted schools will be strived for where feasible

Allowing existing students to remain in their school will be considered by the Board on a study by study basis.

### **SCHEDULE**

August 2021	School Board approves scope of study and directs Superintendent to convene committee and conduct study Superintendent advertises and receives applications for the committee
September 2021	Superintendent appoints committee members and begins sharing information Initial meeting of redistricting committee
October 2021	Committee meets two times to develop multiple redistricting scenarios
November 2021	Two community meetings held to share scenarios and receive feedback Committee meets to finalize recommendation to the Superintendent
December 2021	Superintendent presents his recommendation to School Board
January 2022	School Board holds a public hearing School Board votes on the Superintendent's recommendation
February - August 2022	Families are notified and transition activities take place
2022-23 School Year	New boundaries go into effect







# **COMMUNITY FEEDBACK**

- Participants of the survey were asked to rate their satisfaction of each scenario on a six point scale, with general dissatisfaction being 0 and general satisfaction being 5.
- 250 members of our community took part in this survey.

- Seven community members gave comment at our public hearing meetings.




#### SCENARIO 2.2 ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS Some points to remember

- The committee considered current year enrollment for the proposed new boundaries as well as 19-20 (pre-pandemic enrollment) when making their decision on how many students to move. In addition, the possibility of new students from planned developments was considered when planning future growth.
- Based on current year enrollment, next year we are projecting around 560 students at each school (K-5)
- The pandemic has made projecting enrollment for the long-term very difficult and there remains much uncertainty. If we assume that ACPS enrollment returns to projected levels seen before the pandemic, we might see the following peaks over the next 10 years
  - Brownsville at approximately 700 K-5 students
  - Crozet at approximately 650 K-5 students


### **SCENARIO 2.2 ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS**

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### **HISTORICAL DECISIONS**

- **2018 Woodbrook redistricting**—allowed current fourth grade students and their siblings to remain at their current school for one year. Transportation was provided for students who elected to remain.
- **<u>2013 Agnor-Hurt redistricting</u>**—allowed current fourth grade students and their siblings to remain at their current school for one year. Transportation was not provided for students who elected to remain.
