Question 1: Why I am applying

I have been a resident of the Albemarle Community for over 20 years, and I am the proud parent of two children in ACPS. My son, Thomas Fischbeck, attended Broadus Wood, Journey, and AHS, graduating in 2020. My daughter, Samantha Fischbeck attended Broadus Wood and Journey, and is currently a Junior at AHS. In my 25-year career working education for profit and not for profit organizations as a researcher, strategist, and consultant, I have provided leadership and governance support to counties, school systems, state departments of education, and the federal government on education issues. Unfortunately, until recently, my work travel schedule has limited my local participation in county and school system boards and committees. I have had the honor to serve on the Greater Charlottesville Early Education Coalition for the past five years and I am the Vice President of Finance and Governance for the ACPS Foundation. My career is now allowing me to be at my home in Albemarle County with greater flexibility to dedicate time to what I see as my local civic duties. I am submitting my name for consideration for the open board position as I feel my background as a parent, a former special education teacher, a researcher, as well as my exposure to and experience with county, school system, state, and federal policies and structures will provide an additional perspective to the current school board.

Question 2: Relevant experience

I have worked in public and private schools as an early interventionist, an early childhood inclusion teacher, an early childhood special education teacher, an autism specialist, and a school administrator. I hold a doctorate in research, policy, and school administration from the University of Virginia, where I have also worked as a teacher preparation faculty member and researcher. I have served in C-level positions at for-profit and not-for-profit organizations. In those positions, I have written and quality administered \$5+Million grants, worked with counties, school systems, state departments of education, and the federal government on education issues such as screening and assessment, early childhood education, special education, system development, parent leadership, compliance, and data utilization. I have led small and large (100+) teams to write strategy, negotiate contracts, develop communication and marketing protocols, implement programs, conduct research, and develop continuous improvement processes. I also have extensive experience leading and facilitating large and small group meetings, as well as developing and disseminating white papers and presentations. I have recently authored a book chapter entitled "Broken Promises, Power, and Privilege" in *Child Care Justice: Transforming the System of Care for Young Children*.
