It's Ramadan Curious George by H.A. Rey and Hena Khan

Lailah's Lunchbox by Reem Faruqi

Background:

Albemarle County Public Schools has seen a noticeable increase in the number of Muslim students and families in our community as a result of the placement of families evacuated during Operation Allies Welcome by the Department of Homeland Security and subsequently placed through the International Rescue Committee (IRC). As a result, teachers and staff have looked for additional resources that provide mirrors for these students and their lived experiences and windows for our non-Muslim students into the experiences of their classmates and community.

A team of 9, including school principals, teachers, librarians, students, families, and community partners evaluated two books from the American Federation of Teachers' *Colorin Colorado* resources list, *Lailah's Lunchbox* by Reem Faruqi and *It's Ramadan, Curious George* by H.A. Rey and Hena Khan. Both books are recommended by the Islamic Society of Central Virginia.

Title: Lailah's Lunchbox

Summary:

Lailah is in a new school in a new country, thousands of miles from her old home, and missing her old friends. When Ramadan begins, she is excited that she is finally old enough to participate in the fasting but worried that her classmates won't understand why she doesn't join them in the lunchroom. Lailah solves her problem with help from the school librarian and her teacher and in doing so learns that she can make new friends who respect her beliefs. This gentle, moving story from first-time author Reem Faruqi comes to life in Lea Lyon's vibrant illustrations. Lyon uses decorative arabesque borders on intermittent spreads to contrast the ordered patterns of Islamic observances with the unbounded rhythms of American school days.

Summary: It's the first day of Ramadan, and George is celebrating with his friend Kareem and his family. George helps Kareem with his first fast and joins in the evening celebration of tasting treats and enjoying a special meal. Then, George helps make gift baskets to donate to the needy, and watches for the crescent moon with the man in the yellow hat. Finally George joins in the Eid festivities to mark the end of his very first Ramadan.
