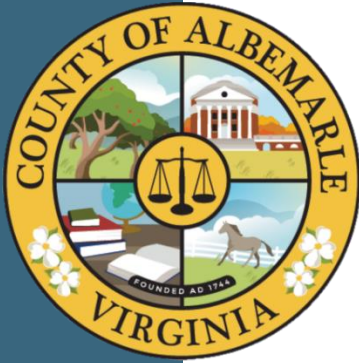


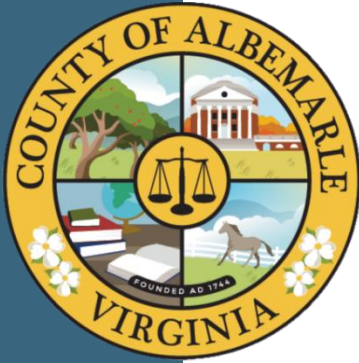

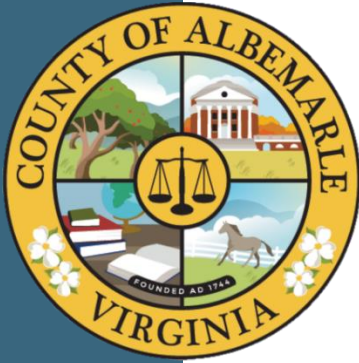

Desired Outcomes

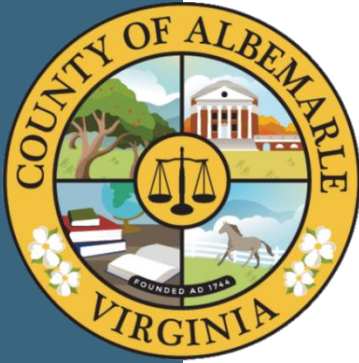
Inform the Board of Supervisors on long-range planning assumptions and the proposed plan's alignment with Strategic Priorities

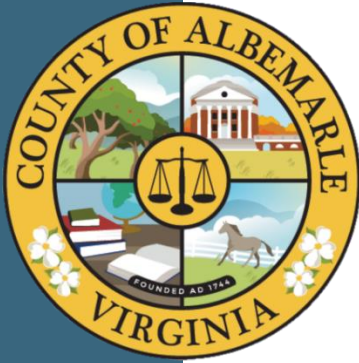

Part of County's adopted Financial Management Policies

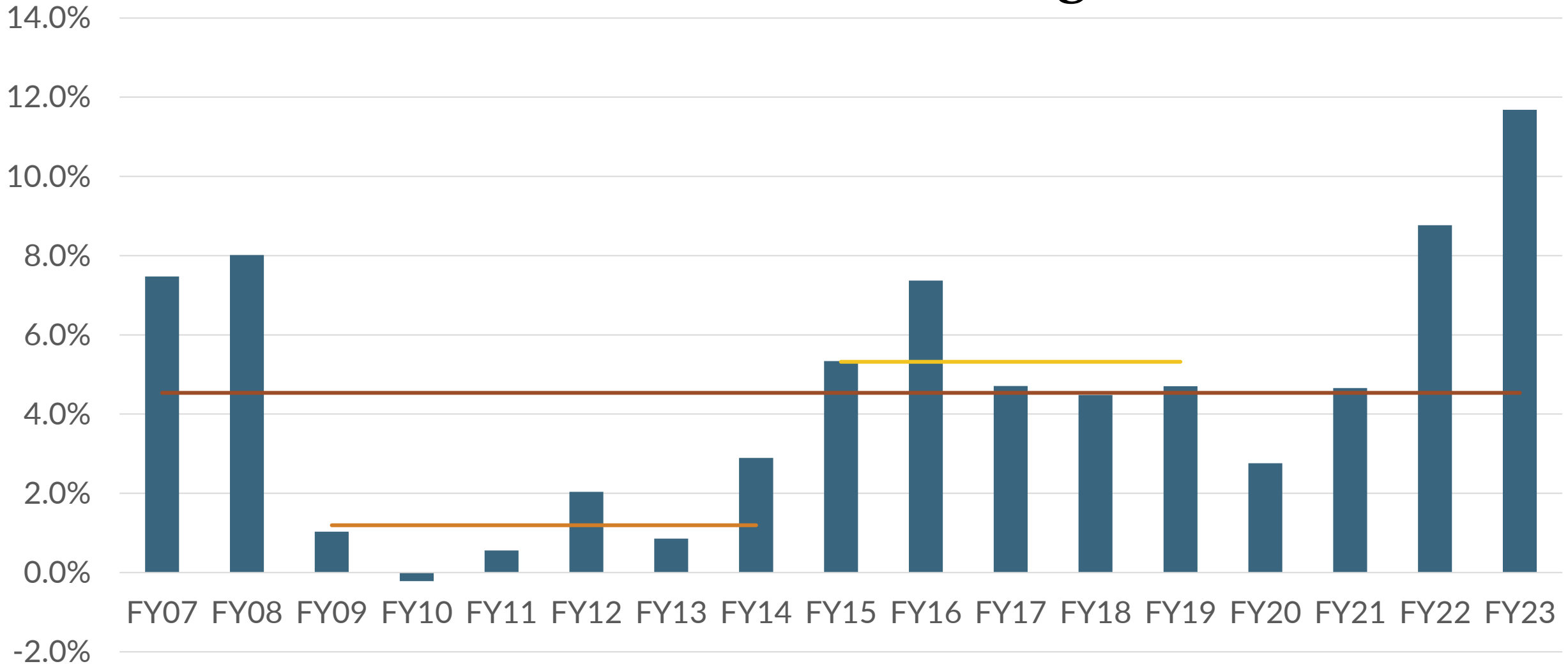
Consideration for:

General Fund Revenue Growth Changes, FY 07 – 23

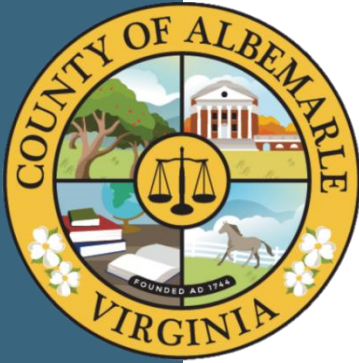


■ Year-to-Year % Change

— Average - Post Initial Recovery to Pandemic



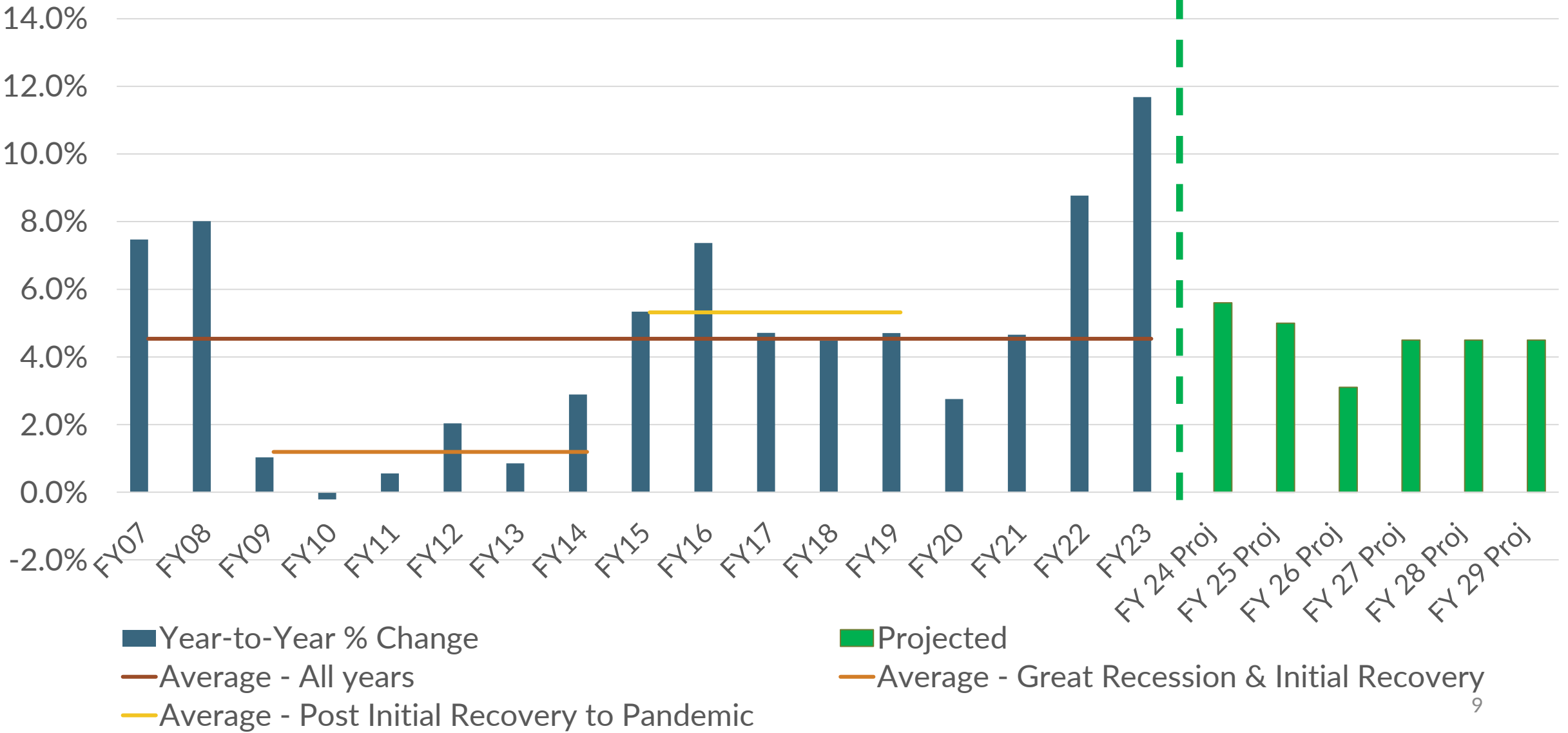

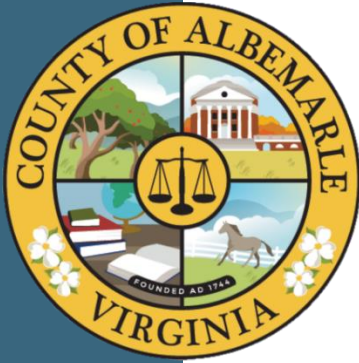
Oct 4 Economic Outlook Report

General Fund Revenue Growth Changes, FY 07 - 23

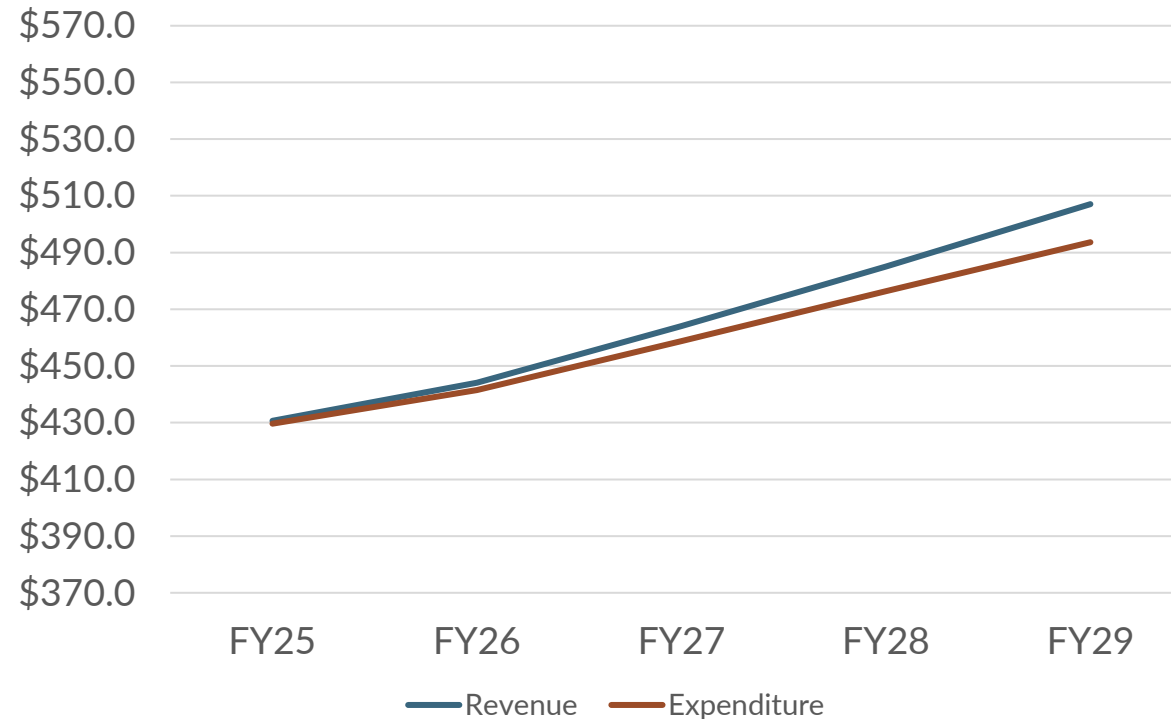
+ FY 24-29 Projection





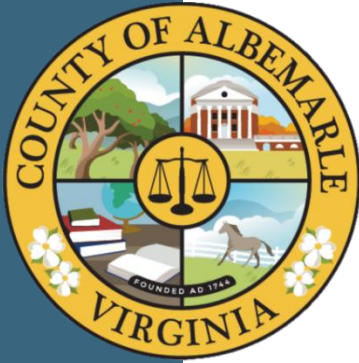
Five-Year Revenues & Expenditures

Includes only mandates & obligations



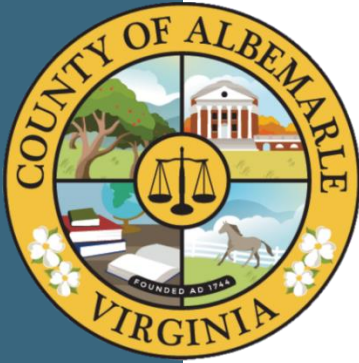
Provides funding to Capital & Debt and School operations based on allocation of local tax revenue formula

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Expenditure Assumptions



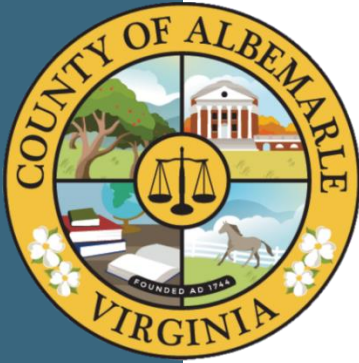

Identify and mitigate community risk while building, sustaining, and validating the community's capability to respond to and recover from disasters and other natural threats.



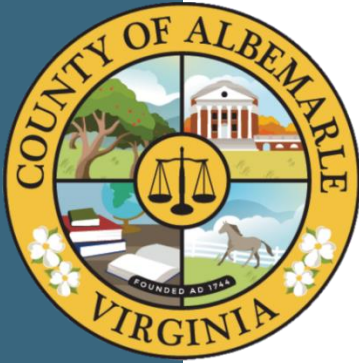

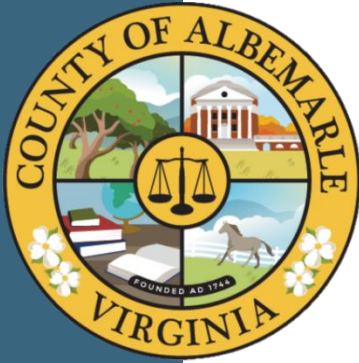

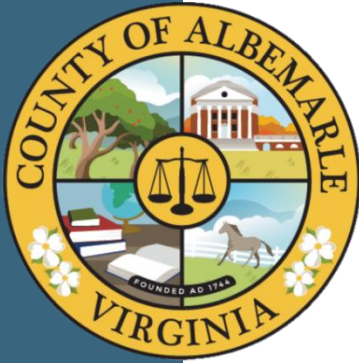

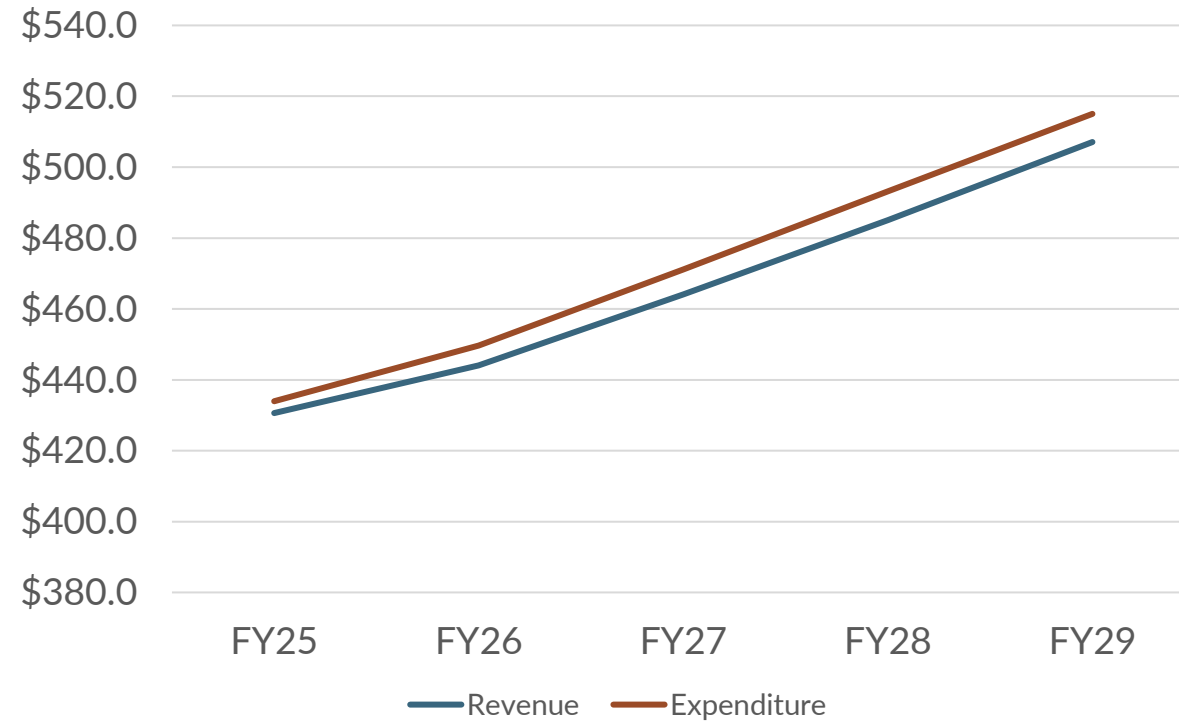

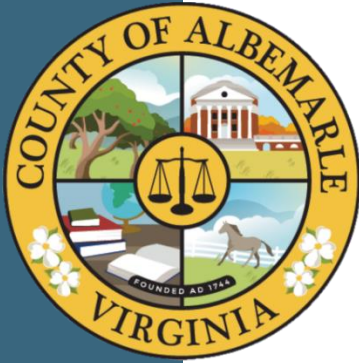
Five-Year Revenues & Expenditures



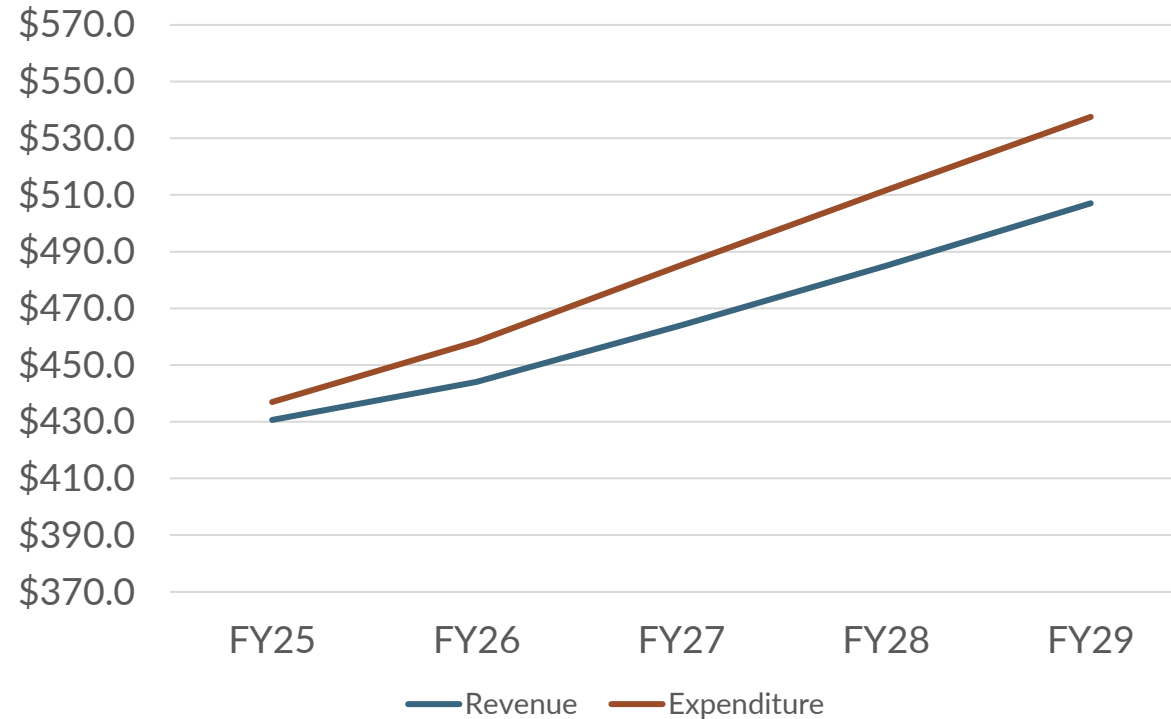

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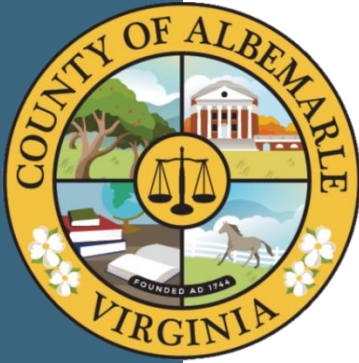
Five-Year Revenues & Expenditures

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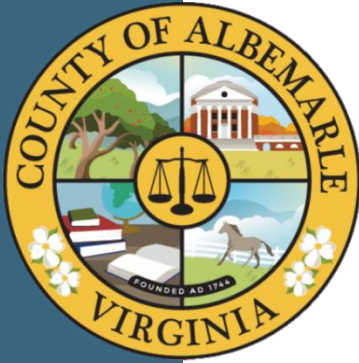
